#### A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

One of the goals of the Hockaday Museum of Art is to develop and maintain a permanent collection of art works that represent the best of historical and contemporary Montana artists as well as those artists who have lived and worked in Montana.

Our permanent collection currently has many pieces that meet this criterion and are on display as a part of the exhibition schedule. However, many fine artists are not as yet represented and it is our hope that gifts from collectors, artists, friends, and purchase funds will help to broaden the collection.

Works of art that are given to the Museum for the permanent collection must first be evaluated by the Permanent Collection Committee and approved by the Board of Trustees, thus assuring that gift items meet the criterion for inclusion in the collection. Works of art that may not find themselves part of the permanent collection are also welcomed and, with the permission of the donor, may be sold or traded for pieces more appropriate to the Hockaday collection.

Since September 2001, the permanent collection has been enriched with five paintings: Walter Hook, Charles Sanderson, Fred Fellows, and Ace Powell: a pastel drawing by Norman Mails; a charcoal drawing by Bud Helbig; a bronze and a wax model by Gary Schildt; two clay models by E. E. Heikka; and a collection of historical stereophotographs of Glacier National Park. We are most grateful to Dr. Van Kirke and Helen Nelson, Norman Hayden, Del Phillips, Dr. Eaner P. Higgins, James L.


